

## Olivet Discourse Parallel

2<sup>nd</sup> Edition

The “Olivet Discourse” is the sermon on the end times that Christ gave His disciples shortly before His death. He gave them the same sermon twice in one day, first in the temple, then later on the Mount of Olives. This is why you may notice some discrepancies between Matthew and Mark’s accounts and Luke’s account. This parallel of the three Gospels (John doesn’t contain the Discourse) is intended to help you better study the events of the last days in conjunction with Daniel and Revelation as you can study the three versions side by side. For <b>false Christs and false prophets</b> shall rise, and shall shew <b>signs and wonders</b>, to <b>seduce</b>, if <i>it were possible</i>, even the elect.</p> <p>23. But take ye heed: behold, I have <b>foretold you all things</b>.</p> <p>24. But in those days, <b>after that tribulation</b>, the <b>sun</b> shall be darkened, and the <b>moon</b> shall not give her light,</p> <p>25. And the <b>stars</b> of heaven shall fall,</p>	<p>and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled.</p> <p>25. And then shall appear <b>the sign of the Son of man</b> in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn,</p> <p>and they shall <b>see the Son of man coming</b> in the clouds of heaven with <b>power and great glory</b>.</p> <p>31. And he shall send his angels with a <b>great sound of a trumpet</b>, and they <b>shall gather together his elect</b> from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.</p> <p>32. Now learn a parable of the <b>fig tree</b>;</p> <p>When his branch is yet tender, and <b>putteth forth leaves</b>, ye know that <b>summer is nigh</b>:</p> <p>33. So likewise ye, <b>when ye shall see all these things</b>, know that it is near, <i>even</i> at the doors.</p> <p>34. <p>42. <b>Watch therefore:</b> for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come.</p> <p>(End of parallel)</p> <p>43.
